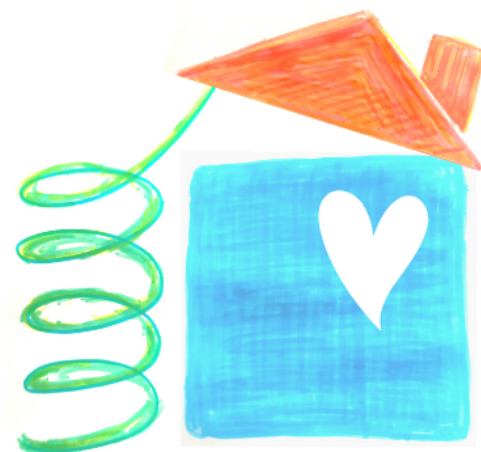

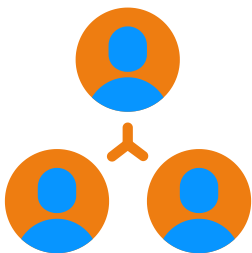
SHORT VIDEO STORIES

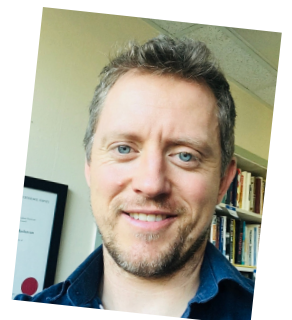
POLLY MCGEE

MORE ABOUT HOW WE WILL WORK

Breakout rooms

During some sessions of the Conference we may have break out rooms - which are like mini Zoom sessions, where the group get divided into smaller groups that will enable you to have conversations in a manageable amount of people.

We will also open the ZOOM rooms before sessions so people can check their set up and make sure technology is working properly. We'll put people into breakout spaces so you can do the networking like you might in the foyer at a face to face conference. Make sure you grab the opportunity to meet someone new.

Set up for Conference at your House

- We recommend that at your Neighbourhood House, or organisation you set up your space to allow for some different activity.
- We'll be encouraging everyone to doodle on paper, and graphically record the things that inspire you or that you want to make note of for action into the future. So ensure you have some butchers paper and coloured pens, and some post-it notes.
- A white board will also be useful for doodling and creating a space for the group to capture the key messages they relate to, or workshop responses to questions raised in the sessions.
- Screen options
 - Where possible, it would be great to have a 2nd screen available - this means you can have one screen for the ZOOM window and another for MURAL. You could also have MURAL open on a completely separate computer - or several computers for that matter.
 - If you only have one screen, you can have two applications running at the same time, and this is called 'Split screen'. You could have a Zoom window and a MURAL window open and accessible at the same time on the same screen. Just google how to 'Split Screen' on your system
- Introductory info to MURAL - we've got one session left on Tuesday 15 September at 2pm. Get in touch if you need the link. We'll also record it so you can view the session in your own time.
- If you are not sure how to use ZOOM - we have some notes on the Conference page of the NHT website
- A back up internet connection. It might be worth having a backup internet connection - perhaps being ready to tether your system to someone's phone. Just be aware of possible extra data charges.
